Harper noted that the bill clarifies service credit contributions, defines fraud and criminal offenses related to benefit payments, establishes appeal procedures, clarifies service status for judges with multiple employers, establishes age restriction for certain inservice distributions, and addresses forfeiture of benefits based on felony convictions. Sen. Riebe asked about benefits contributed by another party to the Utah Retirement System. Sen Harper explained that the bill clarifies previous code so that an individual can only receive service credits if the contributions have been made. Sen. Weiler shared that in the past when judges served each day of the week in a different city, they didn't receive retirement benefits because they weren't considered full-time employees by any city. He explained that this bill addresses and solves that oversight.
