Bill: SJR 7 Joint Resolution Approving Energy Solutions Constructing and Operating a Landfill for Nonhazardous Solid Waste

Sponsor: Sen. Sandall

Floor Sponsor: Rep. Nelson

UASD Position: Tracking

This Resolution: grants provisional legislative approval for the construction and operation of a Class VI commercial nonhazardous solid waste landfill.

Discussion: Rep. Nelson introduced the resolution. There was no discussion.

Bill: 2nd Sub. SB 13 Law Enforcement Internal Investigation Requirements

Sponsor: Sen. Iwamoto

Floor Sponsor: Rep. Wilcox

UASD Position: Tracking

This Bill: adjusts requirements for law enforcement agencies to conduct internal investigations regarding law enforcement officers.

Discussion: Rep. Wilcox introduced the bill. It closes loopholes when an officer separates from a law enforcement agency while an investigation is in progress. There was no discussion.

Bill: SB 101 Motor Vehicle Amendments

This Bill: amends the definition of "handheld wireless communication device" to exclude certain two-way radio devices as related to the use of such a device while operating a motor vehicle.

Discussion: Rep. Winder introduced the bill. There was no discussion.

Bill: HB 87 Electronic Information and Data Privacy Amendments

This Bill: amends provisions related to the privacy of electronic data and information.

Discussion: Rep. Hall introduced the bill. There was no discussion.

Bill: 3rd Sub. HB 158 Juvenile Interrogation Amendments

Sponsor: Rep. Judkins

UASD Position: Tracking with Concern

This Bill: addresses the interrogation of minors who are in custody for an offense.

Discussion: Rep. Judkins introduced the bill. It extends the protections afforded to children 13 and under to all youth regardless of age. Rep. Hollins asked if this applies to the school system and school resource officers. Rep. Judkins said it does. Rep. Hollins spoke in support of the bill. Rep. Gwynn spoke in opposition. Rep. Ward asked when an officer is interacting with a student at school, what's the line at which these protections would need to be invoked? Rep. Judkins said there is usually not a bright line. The officer and courts have discretion. If a child is 13 and younger, this is already in play. Officers already know the difference between having a child in custody for interrogations and simply asking them questions about the incident. Rep. Ward asked if there is a definition of the term "custodial interrogation." Rep. Judkins said "interrogation" is defined in the bill. Rep. Lisonbee spoke in support of the bill. Rep. Lund asked about lines 45-50, which refer to the people who may be present with the child. Could a guardian be there? Rep. Judkins said many times it is unclear whether someone is a child's guardian. There are three types of custody that a child might be in. Section 5 covers some situations that pertain to guardians.

Bill: 1st Sub. HB 59 Intimate Image Distribution Prohibition Revisions

This Bill: provides criminal penalties for the misuse of evidence in certain types of criminal actions.

Discussion: Rep. Stoddard introduced the bill. It makes it a crime for anyone involved in a criminal action to display, copy, or duplicate intimate images. There was no discussion.
