**Bill: 2<sup>nd</sup> substitute HB 187 – Water Amendments**

Discussion: The sponsor presented the Bill. No discussion ensued.

**Bill: HB 349 – Statewide Water Storage**

Sponsor: Representative Brooks

Floor Sponsor: Senator Wilson

**UASD Position: Track**

This Bill addresses water storage within the state.

Discussion: The sponsor presented the Bill. Representative Hansen questioned line 91 regarding the availability of federal loans. The sponsor explained that the department responsible for managing the water resource would determine the appropriate loan.

**Bill: 1<sup>st</sup> substitute HB 32 – Signature Gathering and Verification Amendments**

Sponsor: Representative Cutler

Floor Sponsor: Senator Winterton

**UASD Position: Track**

This Bill modifies requirements for petitions.

Discussion: The sponsor presented the Bill. Representative Shelley spoke in support. Representative Thurston raised concerns about the cost of producing packets for collecting petition signatures, noting the inefficiency of the previous requirement of only two signatures per page. Representative Shelley spoke to the 2<sup>nd</sup> substitute and motioned to adopt it. The 2<sup>nd</sup> substitute failed to be adopted by the House.
