Bill: 1st substitute SB 146 – Industrial Byproduct Amendments

Sponsor: Senator Grover

Floor Sponsor: Representative Bolinder

UASD Position: Track

This Bill addresses provisions related to industrial byproduct reuse.

Discussion: The sponsor explained that the purpose of this Bill is to allow for the use of certain industrial byproducts in public projects in order to reduce costs. Representative Auxier questioned whether the products addressed in the Bill had been used previously. The sponsor responded that the intent of the legislation is to provide municipalities with additional options that could result in cost savings on city projects. Representative Auxier raised concerns regarding the potential leaching of materials from the products. The sponsor clarified that applicable safety regulations and standards are in place to address those concerns.

Bill: 1st substitute HB 319 – Electronic Records Amendments

This Bill modifies provisions relating to county recording of documents and digital authentication.

Discussion: The sponsor presented the 1st substitute and House Amendment 1, which the House adopted. The amendment addresses the treatment of tax information within digital records.

Representative Albrecht questioned whether implementation of the Bill's provisions would be mandatory or opt-in. The sponsor explained that certain physical records would still be required under existing law and that counties would have discretion regarding the extent to which they implement and maintain digital records. Representative Shepherd expressed concerns raised by a title company regarding the Bill's impact. The sponsor clarified that two meetings were held with representatives from title companies to ensure stakeholder input was incorporated into the process.

Bill: HB 240 – Carbon Dioxide Amendments

Sponsor: Representative Nguyen

Floor Sponsor: Senator Owens

UASD Position: Support

This Bill concerns carbon dioxide systems.

Discussion: The sponsor presented the Bill. Representative Peck asked whether manufacturers inspect carbon dioxide tanks. The sponsor clarified that inspections are conducted by a qualified third-party organization, not solely by the manufacturer. Representative Peck further questioned whether the inspections are necessary. The sponsor explained that the state currently utilizes fire marshals to conduct the inspections. The Bill would allow fire marshals to train and authorize others to perform these inspections, thereby reducing the administrative burden on the state while maintaining safety standards.

Representative T. Peterson spoke in support of the Bill and reiterated that, while the carbon dioxide tanks themselves are inspected, the delivery systems are not currently subject to the same inspection requirements. This legislation fixes that oversight. Representative Dunnigan also spoke in support of the Bill.
