**Bill: 1<sup>st</sup> substitute HB 429 - Special Districts Amendments**

This Bill addresses withdrawal of a county or a municipality from a special district under certain circumstances.

Discussion: The sponsor presented the Bill. No further discussion ensued.

**Bill: 2nd substitute HB 41 - Construction and Fire Codes**

**UASD Position: Support**

This Bill modifies the State Construction Code.

Discussion: The sponsor presented the Bill and explained that it addresses challenges faced by insurance companies operating in the wildland-urban interface (“WUI”). The sponsor indicated that when the Bill is placed on the House third reading calendar, a substitute will be brought forward to grant rulemaking authority to the Division of Forestry, Fire, and State Lands and to

provide additional coordination with counties. The substitute is also expected to delay implementation of the fee provision. No further discussion ensued.

**Bill: 3rd substitute HB 32 - Signature Gathering and Verification Amendments**

**Bill: 2nd substitute SB 242 - Transportation Amendments**

This Bill amends provisions related to transportation, including road usage charge, towing dispatch, and local option sales tax use.

Discussion: The sponsor presented Senate Amendment 3, explaining that it reverses the total phasing out of TTIF funds and clarifies that revenue from the 0.1% allocation previously directed to transit and county TTIF will now be deposited into the Commuter Rail Subaccount. The amendment was adopted by the Senate. The sponsor then presented the Bill. No further discussion ensued.
