Bill: 2nd substitute SB – 275 State-Endorsed Digital Identity Program Amendments

Sponsor: Senator Cullimore

Floor Sponsor: Representative Cutler

UASD Position: Track

This Bill creates the State-Endorsed Digital Identity Program.

Discussion: The sponsor explained that the 2nd substitute allows the program to be used for age verification and sunsets the mobile driver's license program once the State-Endorsed Digital Identity Program is implemented. The House adopted the substitute. The sponsor presented the Bill. Representatives Chevrier and Shepherd spoke in support of the Bill.

Bill: SCR 5 – Concurrent Resolution Directing PEHP Regarding Pain Medications

Sponsor: Senator Weiler

Floor Sponsor: Representative Ward

UASD Position: Support

This resolution relates to non-opioid pain medication and state employee health coverage.

Discussion: The sponsor presented the Resolution. Representative Ivory questioned what types of non-opioid medications currently exist. The sponsor explained that new temporary pain-blocking drugs have recently become available. The sponsor noted that these medications are often expensive and stated that the Resolution encourages policies ensuring patients are not required to try opioids before accessing these newer treatments. Representative Ivory spoke in support of the Resolution.

Outcome: SCR 5 passed out of the House.

Bill: 5th substitute SB 151 – Public Safety Funding Amendments

Sponsor: Senator Harper

Floor Sponsor: Representative Pierucci

UASD Position: Support

This Bill modifies provisions related to funding for public safety employees.

Discussion: The sponsor presented the 5th substitute, explaining that the substitute reduces certain appropriations in the Bill. The substitute decreases the transfer to the Motor Vehicle Safety Impact Restricted Account from \$3,700,000 to \$3,000,000, reduces the appropriation for Highway Patrol field operations from \$5,700,000 to \$5,000,000, and reduces funding for the Utah Valley University Fire and Rescue Training project from \$3,700,000 to \$3,000,000. The House adopted the 5th substitute. The sponsor then presented the Bill. There was no further discussion.

Bill: 1st substitute SB 324 – Outcome-based Investment Grant Pilot Framework

Sponsor: Senator Musselman

This Bill establishes the Outcome-based Investment Grant Pilot Framework to provide a process for administering certain grant funding for projects using measurable outcomes.

Discussion: The sponsor presented the Bill. There was no discussion to the Bill.
